DESIGN BRIEF

There is an old world charm to Savannah Squares that makes them very historical. There are a lot of locals who interact with these squares on a daily basis. When these squares are viewed through the eyes of locals, what might the results be?

This research seeks to put a spotlight on these squares and know what people think of these squares and how do these squares contribute in their lives. This qualitative study was designed to find out what emotional insights people have about these squares that make them feel good because of the experience they have in them.

Our research on the public squares in Savannah was conducted following Lextant's research method. We were able to identify eight key values that contribute to the ideal experience people would like to have at these squares, how they feel now, and what would improve their experience. To determine the eight key values, we compiled all of the raw data and identified patterns and commonalities among the participants. What you will see in this report is a synthesised representation of savannah squares.

THE FRAMEWORK

Here is a synthesized representation of ideal experience in savannah squares. Having variety is core to the squares of savannah, as represented by the center of the framework. There are four sections of aspiration to this framework which contains two values each describing the particular section of feeling. In want to feel comfortable there is safety; Convenience. In want to feel Inspired there is history; image. In want to feel relaxed open space; nature. In want to feel engaged there is activities; community. At the base of the framework, are four key enablers that are necessary to truly reach these values: weather, company, location, time.







Overall, the open spaces in public squares provide a much-needed respite from the hustle and bustle of city life, and a chance to unwind and rejuvenate in the midst of nature.





Weather

ENABLERS

The enablers of time, location, weather, and companions can greatly impact how and when a user experiences the public squares in Savannah. The time of day can affect the level of activity in the squares and the availability of amenities. The location of the squares can impact accessibility and convenience for visitors.

The weather can also influence the experience, as hot temperatures may make it less comfortable to spend time outdoors. Additionally, having a companion or group of friends can enhance the social aspect of visiting the squares and make it a more enjoyable experience overall.

Time

The way in which people use public squares is heavily influenced by the time of day and day of the week. During the day, public squares are often used for relaxation, socializing, and as a place to take a break from work or study. During the night, after dark, users often avoid the squares or they must remain more alert and cognizant of their surroundings as a safety precaution

Weather

Weather is a significant factor that influences the use of public squares. While many public squares are designed to be used year-round, inclement weather can limit their usage and affect the type of activities that people can engage in. In Spring the squares offer an area to enjoy the sun but during hot summer days, public squares may can offer shade to those seeking relief from the heat. Overall, weather plays an important role in determining how and when public squares are used, and many public squares are designed to adapt to different weather conditions to ensure their continued usage throughout the year.

Location

Idea 1: Self Checkout Rentals

Building a self checkout rental booth for Savannahians so that they can enjoy their fullest without worrying for arrangements. These booths will be placed in a manner so that they can be accessible to the remaining 4 squares surrounding it. The rental will include- Table, chairs, tents, yoga mats, umbrellas, basketball, golf stick and ball, etc. which will allow the people to have hands free experience of the square.

Idea 2: Running Circuit

Designating squares to specific activities like jogging, movie screening, cafe, gym, play area, etc. so that people get a purpose to visit those squares was our third idea. This will give more opportunity for activities and engagement for locals to indulge in.

Idea 3: Interactive Screens


With the interactive screens in the squares we aim at providing assistance via map, suggestions of places to visit, cafes or restaurants nearby. We will have a QR code to scan and will take the user to the augmented reality in the square. Taking an example of Chippewa square, if the user scans the QR code and holds the camera panning the square, it will show the scene from Forrest Gump and him sitting on the bench. This is a way that history can be made interactive and playful.


